Areas of Interest

George W. Brown, Jr. Chippewa Museum and Cultural Center

The George W. Brown, Jr. Chippewa Museum and Cultural Center offers tours, videos and beautiful dioramas depicting the four seasons of Anishinabe life as it has been lived for centuries.



The Museum celebrates Ojibwe culture with the four seasons diorama and other exhibits including a 24-foot Ojibwe dugout canoe, smaller birchbark canoes, Ojibwe arts and crafts, traditional clothing, a French fur trading post, and a world-record sturgeon taken from one of the area's many beautiful lakes. Year-round programs and classes taught by experienced Chippewa craftspeople are available as well as other special events.

Among the special events are Video Presentations on Ojibwe history and culture, Living History Presentations in which actors and teachers bring history and culture to life; Native Roots Performances by their American Indian theatre troupe, Summer Suppers, Winter Storytelling and Arts & Crafts Workshops. The Center is open May through October, Monday through Saturday from 10 am to 4 pm and November through April, Tuesdays and Thursdays, 10 am to 2 pm. Other times by appointment.

Lac du Flambeau Fish Hatchery

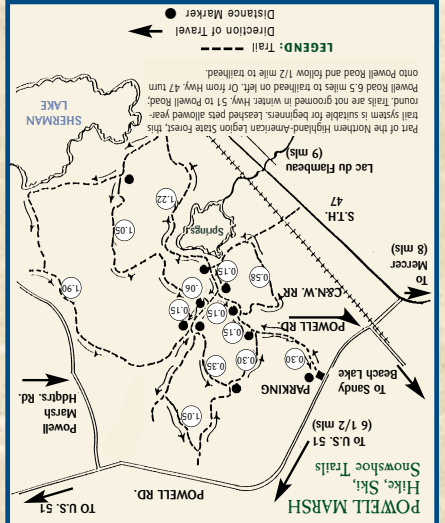
Love to fish, but don't have a license? Maybe you want to make a traditional fish fry or shore lunch with family and friends? When you're in the Lac du Flambeau area you can fish to your hearts content. The Fish Hatchery offers trout fishing daily and no license is needed. You can bring your own equipment or opt for a free bamboo pole and a bit of bait at a nominal fee. The pond is well stocked and catching a rainbow trout for supper is all but guaranteed. The Pond is open Memorial Day through Labor Day, 7 days a week from 7 am to 5 pm.



William J. Poupart, Sr. Fish Hatchery is located at 2500 State Road 47N, 4 miles west of Lac du Flambeau. You'll find plenty of parking, a path from parking to the trout pond and accessible restrooms in buildings. The facility is handicap accessible.

Powell Marsh Wildlife Area

is a popular spot for birders, trappers and hikers. The wildlife area is 4,300 acres and to the south the Lac du Flambeau tribe owns another 8,000 acres of the marsh. There is an 1,800-acre wildlife refuge in the middle of the property.



View birds, waterfowl and other wildlife from the dikes or lookout on Powell Road. Enjoy this pristine area while snow-shoeing and skiing in the winter or hiking during the remainder of the seasons.

Golden Eagle Strawberry Farm

The Golden Eagle Farms is a Pick Your Own Organic Strawberry Farm. The farm opens in June and closes when all the berries are picked. The farm opens at 7:30 am and you can pick berries until 3 pm. For more information call (715) 588-3303.



Lac du Flambeau is the location of sacred Strawberry Island "the place of the little people," a site recognized by the National Register of Historical Places. This island is the place where the last battle between the Sioux and the Ojibwe was fought in 1745. In 1966, the island was identified through an archeological survey as a place with artifacts and remains dating back to 200 B.C. The island is private property, please do not trespass, but photographs are welcome.

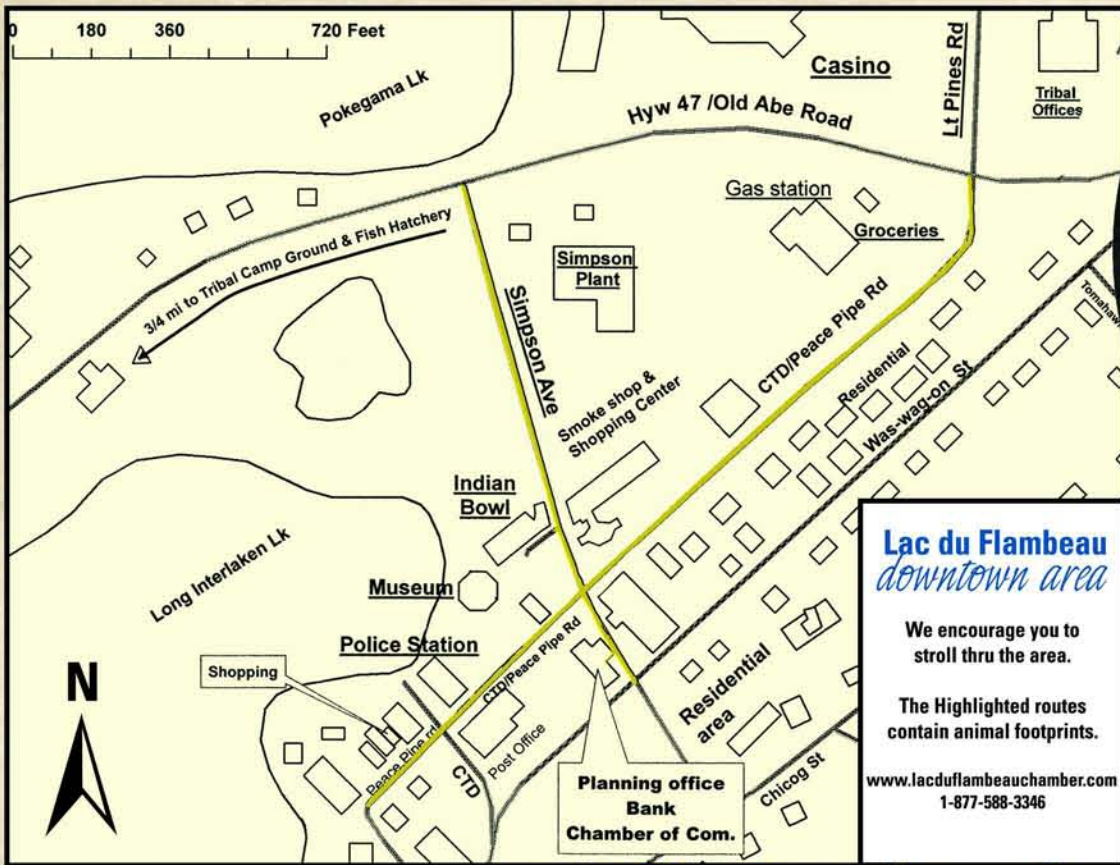

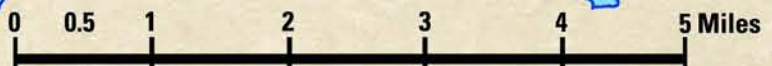
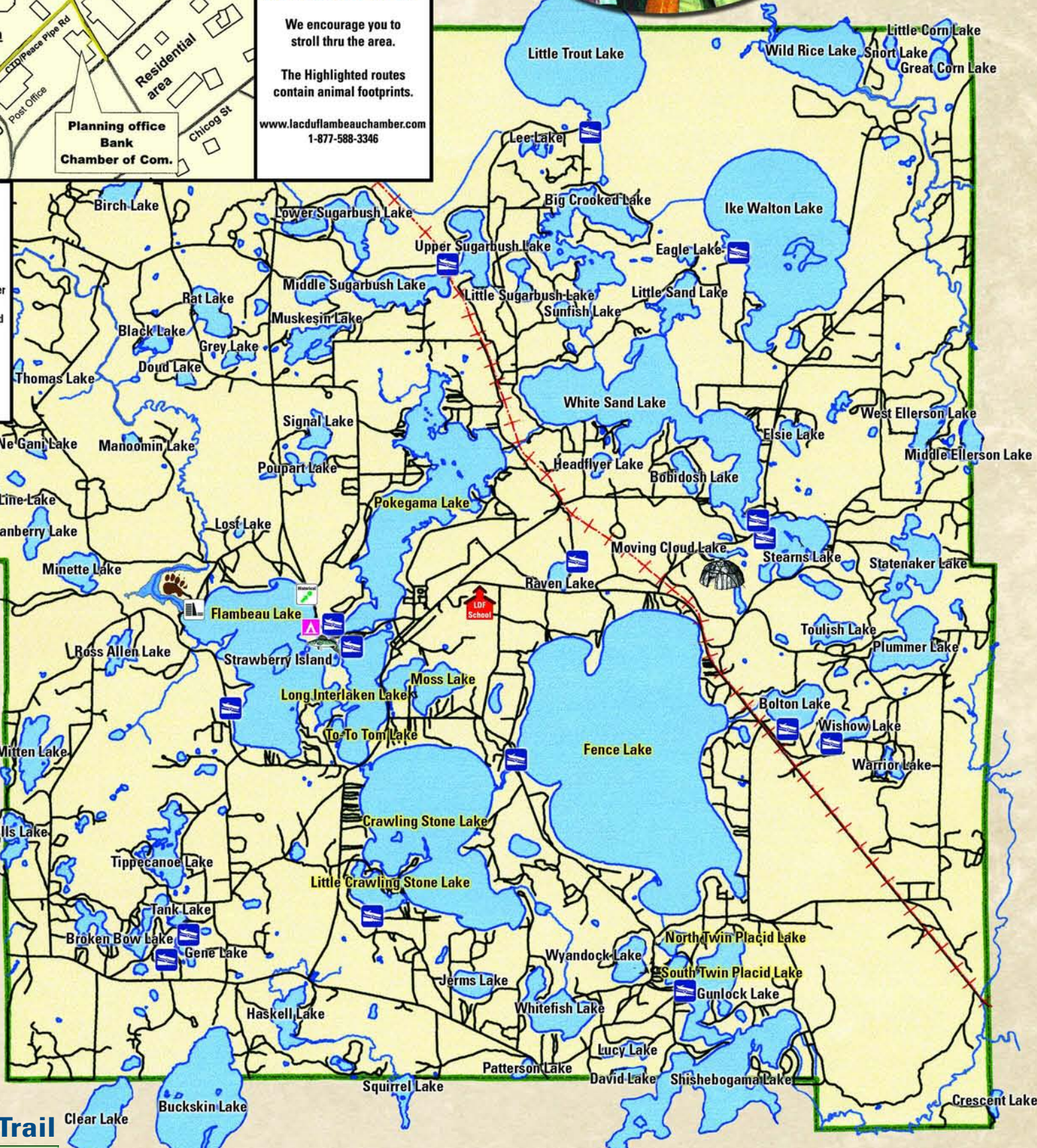
